



Waterford Students Join Parents To Work On Bond Campaign

April 30, 2003 Waterford, Mich. - On Tuesday, April 22, 10:00 a.m., 6020 Pontiac Lake Road, Administration Building, the Waterford School District's Citizen's Advisory Committee, a group of parents who are working on the district's upcoming bond election, will put their children to work on the campaign. Many of our committee member's children will be on hand to make buttons, posters, and other campaign material.

The Waterford community will be asked to approve a \$100 million bond that limits a millage increase to no more than .5 mills, increasing the debt millage rate from 3.17 to 3.67, one of the lowest debt millage rates in Oakland County. The increase equates to approximately \$40 per year, or \$3.33 per month, for the average homeowner in the District.

Projects outlined within this recommendation include capital improvements such as repairing and purchasing new roofs, boilers, and heating and cooling systems; remodeling existing facilities; additional classrooms; technology; and swimming pools at each high school.
