



Mott Senior Earns 12 Varsity Letters during High School Career

April 27, 2004 Waterford, Mich. - Mott High School Senior Eric Chapman is recognized by the Waterford School District for earning 12 varsity letters during his four-year high school career. He is only the second Waterford student to earn this distinction. Chris Avery, Class of 2000, was the first to receive this honor for cross country, baseball, and wrestling.

Chapman earned his varsity letters for participating in football, wrestling, and track each year. In addition to this unique distinction, he was named OAA Scholar Athlete (3.5/4.0 grade point average) each year; named League OAA Heavy Weight and Division, District, and Region Wrestling Champion each year as well. He has also broken numerous wrestling school records including: best record, most wins, most tournament wins, most team points, and he received the MVP Award for the 2003-2004 school year.

When Chapman is not on participating in sports, you will find him in several honors and advanced placement courses. He also was involved in two independent studies program: MTS (math, technology, and science) and Foreign Studies. He has been class president each of his academic years, served on student council, and has excelled in the jazz and concert bands at Mott High School.
