The many delightful stories feature colorful characters such as: a shy little boy who insists on playing the "pig" in his class production of *Cinderella* and steals the show; a 'mother-of-the-bride' who brilliantly orchestrates the perfect wedding until the bowling ball of fate rolls down the aisle; and a modern day Greek philosopher who finds the meaning of life in a piece of broken mirror from WWII.
