



Waterford School District Receives 2004-2005 Exemplary Physical Education Award

September 14, 2004, Waterford, Mich. - The Waterford School District has received the Michigan Governor's Council on Physical Fitness, Health, and Sports Exemplary Physical Education Award for the curriculum work the district's staff completed during the 2003-2004 school year. The Governor's Exemplary Physical Education Award is designed to encourage and reward exemplary programs and is the third consecutive year the Waterford School District has been recognized for its exemplary curriculum.

During the 1992-93 school year, Governor John Engler charged the newly formed Michigan Governor's Council on Physical Fitness, Health and Sports to develop materials and procedures that will enable schools to establish exemplary physical education programs. Michigan's Exemplary Physical Education Curriculum Project (EPEC) was formed in 1994-1995 to accomplish this task.

Physical Education and Athletic Supervisor Tim Domke and Dr. Ray Allen, Central Michigan University, were instrumental in implementing this exemplary physical education program in the Waterford School District.

The award will be presented on Thursday, November 11, 2004 during the Award Reception held by the Michigan Association of Health, Physical Education, recreation and Dance (MAHPERD) in Kalamazoo.
