Kettering and Mott High School AP Scholars Recognized

October 8, 2007 Waterford, Mich. – Eighteen Kettering and Mott High School students have earned the designation of AP Scholar by the College Board in recognition of their exceptional achievement on the college-level Advanced Placement Program (AP) Exams. The College Board's Advanced Placement Program offers students the opportunity to take challenging college-level courses while still in high school, and to receive college credit, advanced placement, or both for successful performance on the AP Exams. About 18% of the more than one million high schools students in more than 15,000 secondary schools worldwide took AP Exams performed at a sufficiently high level to merit the recognition of AP Scholar.

AP Scholar with Distinction Awards were given for earning an average grade of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 3 or higher on five more on these exams:

Alexander Cohen, Kettering High School and Jeffrey Wyka, Mott High School.

The **AP Scholar with Honor Award** is earned for receiving an average grade of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams:

Cory Pitzer and Brendan Kirchner, Kettering High School and Christina Colcernian, Mott High School.

Most of the nation's colleges and universities award credit, advanced placement, or both based on successful performance on the AP Exams. More than 1,400 award a full year's credit (sophomore standing) to students presenting a sufficient number of qualifying grades.
